A wave of discrimination swept over the Kashmiri vendors earlier this year. Every day a new assault story emerged where they were targeted merely for earning. Amidst all the stories, one story took the entire nation: the story of Tabish. 18-year-old Tabish, along with his brother Danish, was on the streets of Vikasnagar, Uttarakhand selling shawls just to earn a living to ease the burdens of the family.

On feeling hunger, he approached a shopowner to buy food, who in turn asked his identity. Upon learning the Kashmiri and Muslim identity, the shopkeeper attacked him brutally. Tabish was hit violently on his head, making him fall unconscious; his body turned blue with bruises all over it. His hand was fractured, and head injury attained 18 stitches. Miles2smile travelled to Himachal Pradesh, where Tabish was living with his family in a rented house. The team met Tabish's family and decided to set up a shop for him for the family's livelihood.
