Assalamalikum Dear Donors,

The month of Ramadan has passed, and so has Eid, but the happiness they have ignited through your generosity continues to live on. In just one month, you touched thousands of lives and created abounding stories of hope. Your contribution travelled not only in one city or state but to every nook and cranny of crisis-affected areas. It travelled through narrow lanes, broken terrain, withering roads, and fortified mountains, spawning happiness and eclipsing pain.

Miles2Smile would like to take a moment to share how your contributions made a meaningful impact this Ramadan—and how your zakat transformed lives.



For the past six years, we have been working with survivors of mob lynching, communal violence, targeted demolitions, and hate crimes, as well as with orphans, refugees, the wrongfully incarcerated, and the economically marginalized. Over time, we have come to see them not merely as survivors but as our family.

And just as families are glued to one another through every phase of life, we believe it is our responsibility to support the survivors in living lives of dignity and ease—not only occasionally, but consistently, especially during the sacred month of Ramadan.

With this commitment, we launched our Ramadan fundraiser to become their pillars of hope. With you by our side, generosity poured in. Through your support, we were able to create livelihood opportunities, distribute essential rations, arrange iftar and suhoor meals, support children's education, and bring a sense of comfort and relief to many households.

As Miles2Smile remains deeply committed to transparency and to nurturing relationships built on trust—values we believe are essential to building the compassionate future we envision. With this in our hearts, through this report, we would like to unfurl a glimpse of the work made possible through your support and trust in our mission.



(A) Livelihood

As the creation of livelihood remains one of the core missions of Miles2Smile, this Ramadan we buttressed the cause, met surviving families of communal violence, mob lynching, hate crime and provided them with a dignified source of income. In our attempt to provide financial stability, we were able to create eight livelihoods this Ramadan through your contribution.

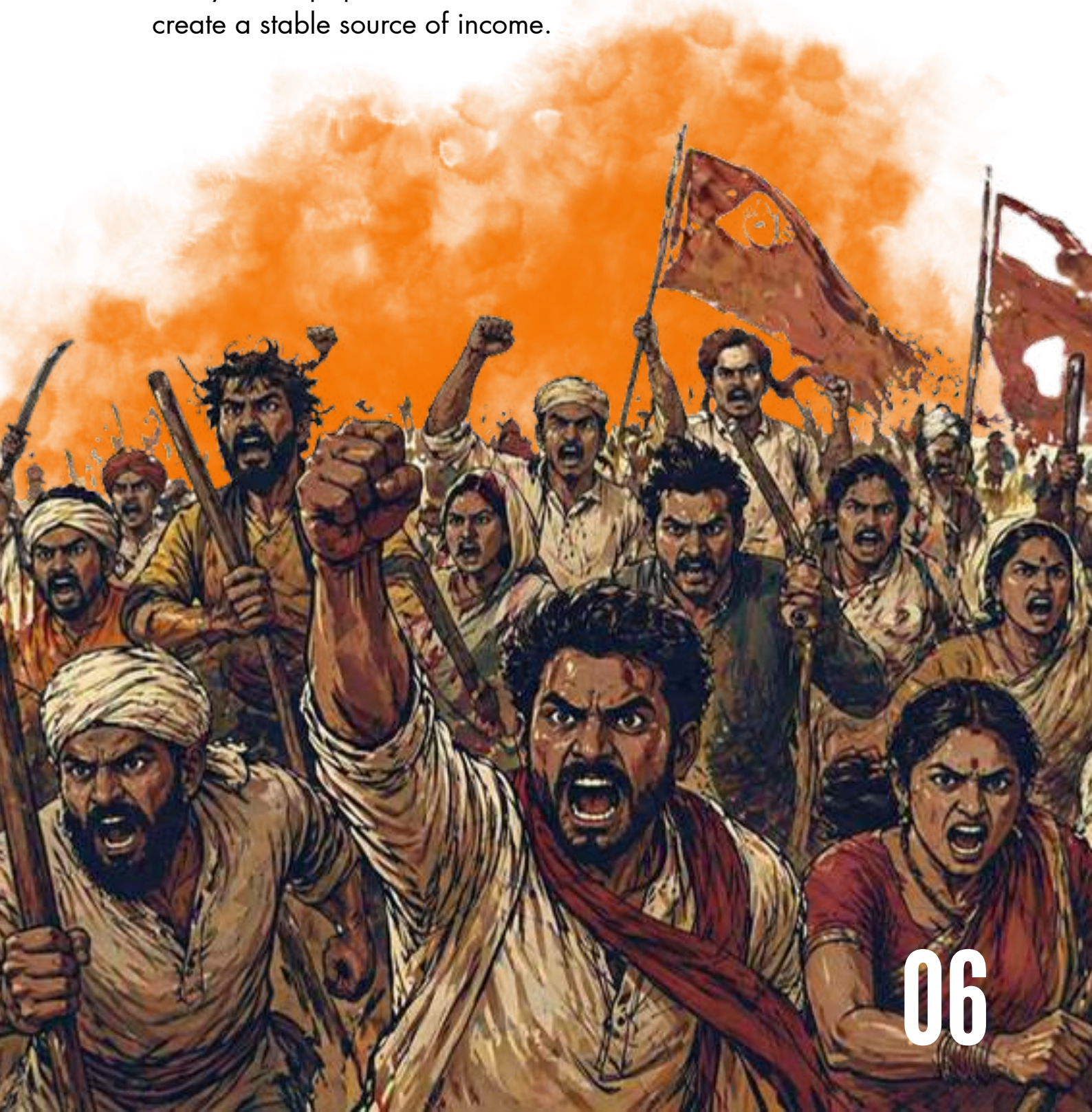
The livelihood creation was done in two major category:

1. Mob Lynching
2. Communal Violence



(A1) Livelihood Creation for Mob Lynching Survivors

In the month of Ramadan, numerous stories of mob lynching surfaced across the country. Each story expanded the pain, overwhelming the hearts. Miles2Smile met several families and, with your help, provided them with funds to run their houses and create a stable source of income.

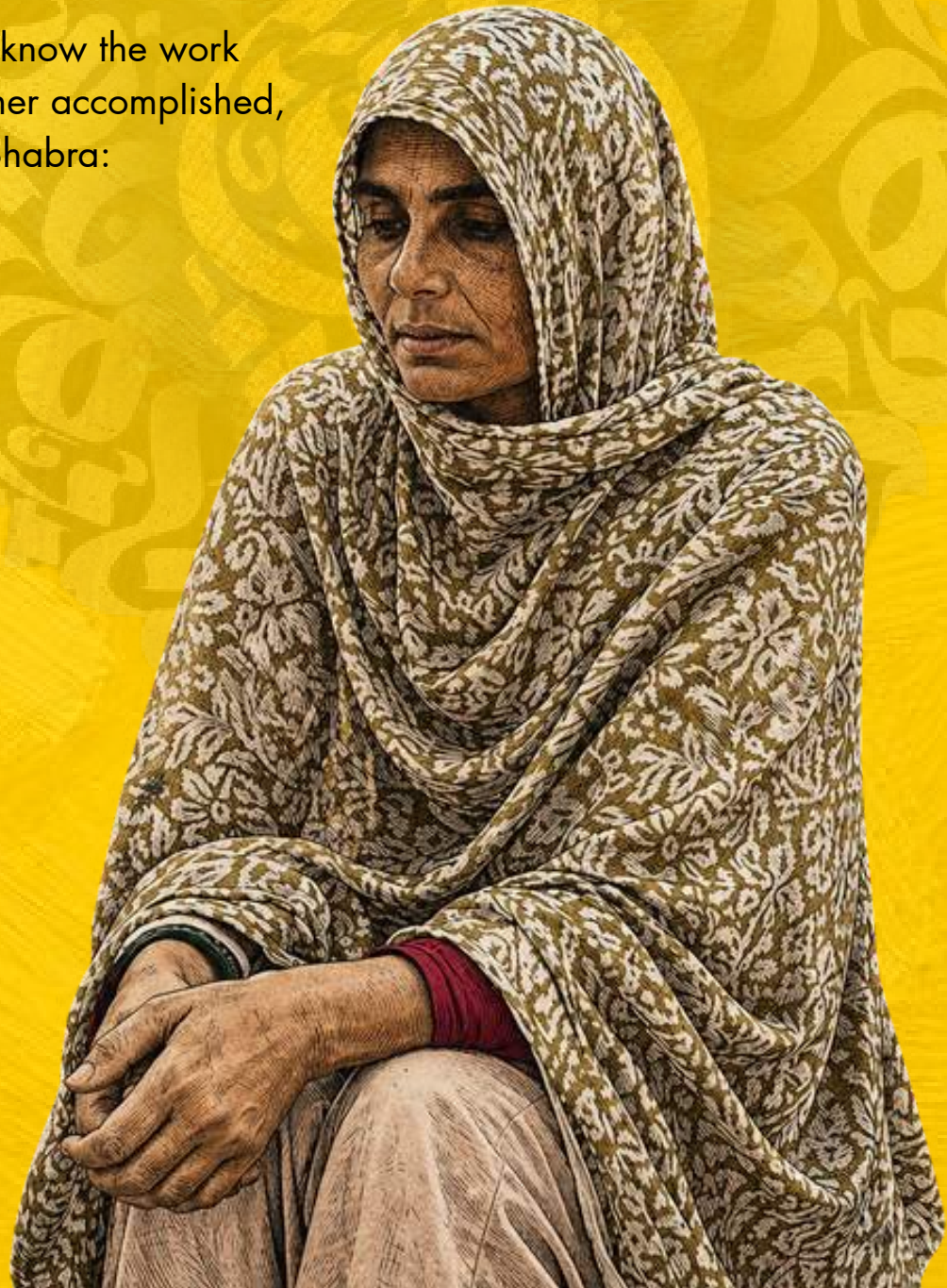


A1.1 Shabra

On March 2, 2026, Shabra's son Aamir was driving his pickup truck when self-styled cow vigilantes intercepted him near Bhiwadi, ramming his vehicle to a halt. Within moments, he was brutally attacked and shot in the head, dying within hours. Aamir is survived by a pregnant wife and a young daughter too little to comprehend the loss. His unborn child will never know a father's presence. The family, left without its sole breadwinner, faced severe hardship. Observing their condition, Miles2Smile raised funds to support medical needs and daily expenses, offering some relief and stability during an unimaginably difficult time.

A1.2 Rabiya Bi

"The shadow of their father has been lifted from my children's heads. How will I raise them alone? I don't even earn," said Rabiya Bi, recalling the day her husband, Umarudeen, was shot dead while trying to protect their son from a fanatic mob in New Delhi on 17th February, 2026.

Umarudeen tried to save his son, like a father, but little did he know this would cost him his life. He was shot dead by the perpetrators.

With no steady income and the burden of raising her children alone, Rabiya's days passed in uncertainty and fear about the future until Miles2Smile met her. The organization provided assistance to help her start a small livelihood, giving her a means to earn and provide for her children.

The support has offered Rabiya a measure of stability, helping her take the first steps toward rebuilding her life after devastating loss.

A2 Livelihood creation for Communal Violence survivors

In the month of February 2023, Northeast Delhi found itself burning and melting; 54 people were killed and 23 women were left widowed, most of them belonging to the Muslim community. The overwhelming number of deaths shattered many families, each carrying the weight of financial fragility. For the past six years, Miles2Smile has been in contact with these families, trying to stitch their lives back together, piece by piece.

This Ramadan we found three families still lamenting the loss, grieving the pain, and struggling to make ends meet. Miles2Smile raised funds for their livelihood and helped them attain stability.



A2.1 Asma Khatoon

The violence in Tripura also targeted the village's only mosque, Jama Masjid. Its walls are almost crumbling, with roofs too fragile to provide shelter, waiting for people to show mercy and construct it again for Ramadan. We raised funds for the mosque's construction, but it was only through the help of people like you that we were able to rebuild the entire mosque in such a short span of time. Your contribution helped the mosque echo its call for prayer five times a day for the entire month, without any hindrance.

Several Muslim-owned homes and shops were also set ablaze along with the mosque. Among those destroyed was a shop owned by Asma Khatoon, a woman who relied on it for her livelihood. Constructed from bamboo with an asbestos roof, the shop was reduced to ashes within hours, slowly eroding her source of income.

Khatoon stood before the smouldering remains as the mob continued its assault. Days after the violence, she remained firm that her shop can be rebuilt with the same determination with which she once raised it. Fortunately, her hopes got tangible results and her shop now stands stall like before.



A2.2 Ali Ahmed

The charred truck, with broken gates and dismantled seats, stands behind Ali Ahmed. The picture of the truck haunts him. Until recently, it was the source of his happiness and livelihood; now the truck lies mercilessly burned. But how? The question remains.

On January 10, 2026, violence unfolded in Fatikroy, Tripura, where Muslim residents were allegedly targeted by a mob following an altercation over the collection of funds for a local Hindu temple. Several Muslim-owned homes, shops, businesses, and other valuable assets, along with a mosque, were allegedly set ablaze. The burns of the violence were borne by innocent people like Ali Ahmed.

“I worked for so many days to earn enough to buy the truck. It was taken on loan, but they burned it entirely. I have no other source of income; this was my only livelihood. What will I do now? How will I run my house without any income?” asks Ali, with a face as stoic as it could be.

Miles2Smile travelled to Tripura and met Ali Ahmed, heard his stories, and promised him a truck for his livelihood. Shortly after the visit, the promise took tangible form, and his truck was purchased through your generous support, helping him attain financial stability again.

A2.3 Jumara Begum

Jumara Begum, survivor of the 2026 Tripura violence, recalled how her life changed on January 10, 2026, in Fatikroy. Jumana Begum's husband Musabbir Ali was on his way to work when a mob allegedly stopped him and demanded donations for Bhairab Mela. When he refused, stating he would contribute later as in previous years, the situation escalated. The mob allegedly attacked him, beating him severely, which marked the beginning of widespread violence in the area.

The unrest soon spread across the village. The mob allegedly set fire to shops, homes, and the local mosque, leaving residents devastated. Many people suffered injuries, lost their homes, and faced wrongful incarceration despite being victims of the violence.

Musabbir Ali also lost his livelihood as his shop was destroyed, and he was later arrested, deepening the family's crisis.

His family was left without income or stability, struggling to cope with the aftermath of the violence. With no support system, they faced severe financial hardship. In response, Miles2Smile provided immediate financial assistance to help them meet daily needs and later supported the rebuilding of Musabbir's shop, helping the family regain some stability and hope for recovery.



A2.4 Nargis

Nargis was pregnant at the time the Delhi riots unfolded in February 2020, and suddenly she found herself alone with three children and no source of income as her husband, Musaleen, was killed on 24th of February, 2020. In the days that followed, the family struggled for basic necessities, often going without proper meals. Years later, their financial condition remained fragile, with Nargis trying to hold the family together amid continuing hardship.

Throughout these six years, Miles2Smile has been in touch with Nargis, taking care of her basic needs, including enrollment of her children in our relief school, Sunrise Public School. Months before Ramadan, Nargis demonstrated an inclination towards burgeoning her small sewing business. Miles2Smile provided Nargis with an efficient sewing machine. Unfortunately, the business did not bloom, leaving Nargis with no stable source of income yet again. This Ramadan, we provided Nargis with sustained support, providing her with funds to run the daily expenses and start a stable source of livelihood.

A2.5 Malika

The last memory of her husband, Musharraf, still haunts Malika, a woman who lost everything to the Delhi riots of 2020. On 25th February 2020, chants of religious slogans shrieked through her house as rioters broke the main gate. What followed was something Malika never fathomed. Rioters beat her husband to death. She had hidden him under the bed after her landlord warned that armed mobs carrying torches and iron rods were moving from door to door, hunting down Muslim men. But rioters found him and killed him.

With the killing of Musharraf on 25th February, 2020, Malika also lost her children's only source of income. Miles2Smile raised funds to help her and constructed a 1BHK flat for her to rent out and provide a stable source of income.

A2.6 Nazish

Nazish weaves charpais in her small room, her hands moving steadily across a wooden frame, sustaining her family after losing her husband, Jamaluddin, to the 2020 Delhi riots. Once the sole breadwinner, his death forced her into relentless labor, leaving little income and halting her sons' education. With support from the Miles2Smile Foundation, her children were enrolled in Miles2Smile's Sunrise Public School, restoring her hope. However, her charpai weaving work could not bring sufficient income. To sustain financial stability, Nazish dreamt of completing the half-built upper floor of her house for rental income.

Miles2Smile helped her out in constructing the same through a fundraiser. The initiative helped her earn sufficient income and a stable life.

(B) Ration Kit Distribution

Ramadan, for many of us, comes with happiness, without worry. But others struggle to arrange even a meal a day. In many of these cases, the breadwinners have been sliced down to death by the mob or have been wrongfully incarcerated, or their houses have been razed down, impacting their lives and livelihood, or they have been severely impacted by communal violence and hate crimes, or they belong to refugees, or they belong to the families whose financial roots are fragile.

To help them spend their Ramadan with ease, we, with the help of your donations, distributed 198 ration kits to them. In doing so, we covered the areas like Nuh, Northeast Delhi, Shamli, Saharanpur, Ghatmika, and more.



B1.1 Saddam

Saddam Qureshi (23), along with his two companions, was traveling via private truck loaded with buffaloes on June 7, 2024, when he encountered mob lynching. The mob persuaded them for approximately 54 km, assaulted them, killed two of Saddam's companions on the spot, and gravely injured Saddam. Twenty-three-year-old Saddam eventually succumbed to his injuries on June 18, 2024.

Saddam left behind a heartbroken mother, a devastated father, and two grief-stricken sisters. The incident blurred the lives of Saddam's family, with sadness running all across their bodies. Saddam was the sole breadwinner of the family. To restart the financial stability of the family, Miles2Smile purchased two healthy buffaloes for them to facilitate a milk-supply business and provided them Rs. 50,000 for medical expenses. Alongside this, every Ramadan, we visit Saddam's family and give them ration kits. This small gesture always brings a heartfelt smile on their face.

B1.2 Sajida

On February 16, 2023, Nasir (25) and Junaid (35) were threatened, brutally beaten, set on fire, and killed while travelling from their home. Nasir left behind a wife and an adopted daughter, and Junaid is survived by four sons, two daughters, and their mother, Sajida. Junaid's 15-year-old daughter, attached to her father, could not bear the news of the brutality her father was put through, fell ill, and lost her life in May 2023.

Amidst all this, Sajida was not only devastated but also found herself without financial stability. She could not manage to make ends meet until Miles2Smile came as a peacemaker. Her sons presented an interest in academics but could not attend school due to financial constraints. Miles2Smile facilitated admissions to a private boarding school in Rajasthan. To create financial stability, Miles2Smile incorporated a cosmetic shop for Sajida, which has borne fruits. To give the family a sense of love and belonging, every month we provide them with ration kits. This year, like others, we provided them with the kits, and seeing their smiling faces warmed our hearts.

B1.3 Fatima

Fatima's Son Sameer was lynched to death in September 2021. He completed his training as a mechanic and had joined Tata Sales at Shamli two months before his lynching. A wave of happiness swept over the family when they learned about his job; little did they know their unbridled happiness would soon be taken away.

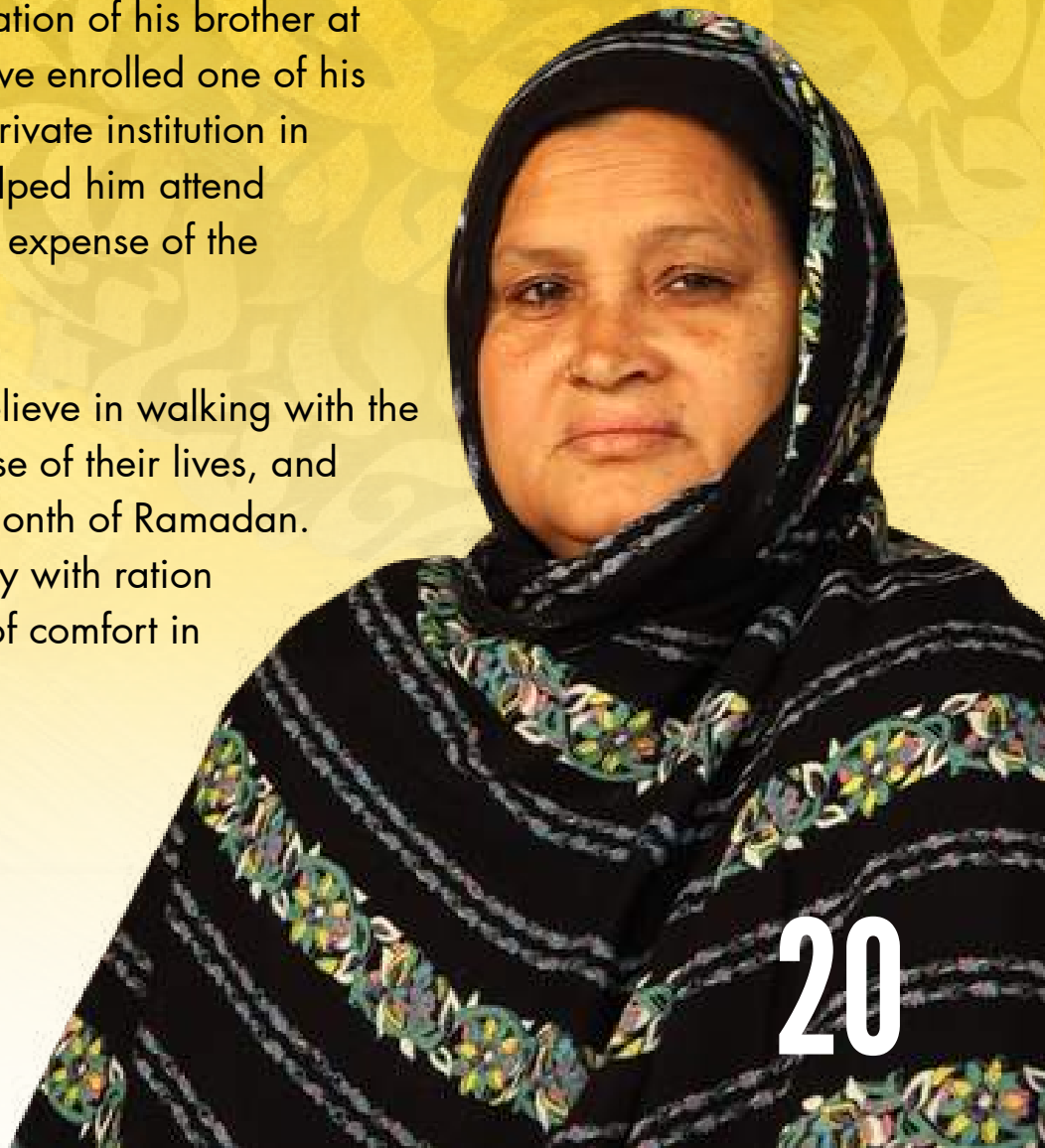
On an ill-fated day, Sameer went to open his bank account, and on his way he was assaulted brutally by an alleged Hindu extremist mob. The attackers kept smashing his head on the road till he lost his consciousness. Meanwhile, eyewitnesses came to rescue him and rushed him to a local hospital, where he was referred to another hospital, as his injuries were grievous.

30K for Medical expense

Following this, Sameer was rushed to a private practitioner, who declared him dead. The reality felt heavy on Sameer's family, and the future seems heavier, with the education of his brother at a halt. Subsequently, we enrolled one of his brothers, Rihan, in a private institution in Banat, Shamli, and helped him attend classes by bearing the expense of the school fee.

At Miles2Smile, we believe in walking with the survivors in every phase of their lives, and one such walk is the month of Ramadan.

We provided the family with ration kits, creating a sense of comfort in their hearts.



Refugees, Orphans and Widows,

The refugees, orphans, widows, and families of the wrongfully incarcerated are some of the most vulnerable and devastated individuals in our society. While we celebrate Ramadan, they sit with memories of their past lives. To provide them a sense of family, every Ramadan, miles2smile, visit their homes, share their pain and arrange for their meals by providing them ration kits. Given below is the breakdown of our ration distribution for this Ramadan.

(C) LEGAL ASSISTANCE

The month of Ramadan witnessed a horrific assault of a Muslim woman, Roshan Khatoon, in Bihar's Madhubani. Khatoon was assaulted for a long period of time, which later resulted in her death on March 1st, 2026. The brutality she was subjected to includes kicks, punches, and beatings from sticks. Khatoon fell unconscious, but the attack did not stop. Khatoon was dragged outside in public, tied to a gate, and another set of attacks was launched. Unable to bear the pain, she asked for water, but she was given a mixture of alcohol and urine.

The death of Khatoon jolted the family. They wanted justice, but the legal procedures cost heavily. Miles2Smile provided the family with legal assistance of Rs.100,000 and remains committed to helping the family throughout the legal journey.

(E) DASTAGIR

The Dastagir initiative by Miles2Smile supports the families of people who have been wrongfully incarcerated. In many of these cases, the imprisoned person was the sole breadwinner, and their absence left the family struggling to meet daily needs. Through this initiative, Miles2Smile provides educational support for children, livelihood assistance, and a monthly allowance to help families manage basic expenses. The aim is to ensure that these households can continue their lives with stability while their loved ones remain in prison.



This Ramadan you helped six families whose members were wrongfully incarcerated in Tripura through our Dastagir initiative. These members are as follows:

(F) Your Contributions to Our Ongoing Projects

As we launched our new relief and rehabilitation projects, your zakaat and donation also made their way towards our then-ongoing initiatives. The primary one is **Tripura, Kashmir, and Assam** relief work. On January 10, 2026, violence broke out in Fatikroy, Tripura, after an alleged dispute over the collection of funds for a local Hindu temple. Muslim residents were reportedly targeted, with several homes, shops, and a mosque set on fire. Before the community could recover, another blow followed: police arrested those who were allegedly victims of the violence.

Many were the sole breadwinners, and their detention pushed families into sudden hardship. Miles2Smile travelled to Tripura to assess the damage and reach those in need, including those whose family members were wrongfully incarcerated through our initiative Dastagir.



F1.1 Assam

Over the August of 2025, Assam saw an aggressive, widely reported wave of eviction operations that cleared tens of thousands of bighas of land and demolished thousands of Muslim families' homes and shops.

Their lives were suddenly reduced to uncertainty. They were forced to live under the tarpaulin sheets, which were too thin to save them from the heat. Miles2Smile travelled to Assam, met the survivors, and provided them 500 tarpaulin sheets, clean water, conducted medical camps, and took care of their survival.

The Current Status

This year due to intense heat, these survivors required additional sheets. Miles2Smile remained committed and arranged for the sheets, the transfer of which was underway. In addition to this, Miles2Smile aims to organize regular medical camps in the area to tackle the health and hygiene crises that the people face.

F1.2 Kashmir

A twin cloudburst and landslide occurred in Jammu and Kashmir during the month of September 2025, claiming the homes, education, and health of people. With your zakaat, Miles2Smile was able to provide tarpaulin sheets and educate the children by inaugurating learning centers, Habba Khatoon and Wahid Ali Memorial. A few later, we inaugurated two more learning centers: Sultan Jahan and Jana Begum. Through our learning we are not only teaching English, Hindi, math, computer, and science but also Hifz and Aalimiyat.

The Current Status:

The Warwan valley of J&K, one of the most devastated areas after the incident, still requires assistance in several areas, including health and hygiene and education. Miles2Smile conducts frequent visits and assists them in improving health and hygiene through medical camps and education through learning centers.

F1.3 Tripura:

A violent clash occurred in Tripura's Fatikroy on January 10, 2026; Muslim shops were burnt, houses were destroyed, livelihoods were erased, and Muslim residents were wrongfully incarcerated. Miles2Smile travelled to Tripura's Fatikroy and measured the scale of loss, which was massive, and provided the following assistance.

1. Reconstructed Jama Masjid, the only mosque in the area, which was not spared by the mob either.
2. Reconstructed shops, revamped the pickup trucks, and restarted the livelihoods.
3. Provided assistance in meeting daily expenses of the family of those who were wrongfully incarcerated.

All these were possible only because of your your zakaat and other donation.

The Current Status

At Miles2Smile, we believe in providing not only short-term but also long-term support to the survivors until they attain stability. Our Tripura relief work continues to provide respite to the survivors with the construction of shops, homes, and livelihoods underway.

(G) A PROMISE FOR EDUCATION

During our Ramadan relief work and meeting families, providing rations, and sharing love, we learned about an unaddressed education hindrance in a few families. We met Firdos. Firdos's children's education. Firdos also lost her husband in the Delhi riots of 2020. We promised Firdos to facilitate her children's education and enrolled them in our learning programs. This Ramadan, through Miles2Smile and your support, Firdos could not only get ration kits but also the education of her children.

A few months later, Miles2Smile also facilitated the education of children of Roshana Khatoon, who was brutally assaulted during Ramadan and succumbed to her injuries on March 1st. Khatoon was assaulted for a prolonged period of time with kicks, beatings, and punches launched on her. When she asked for water, Khatoon was given a mixture of urine and alcohol.



Your Zakaat became a source for a bright future. Along with that, it also helped in the functioning of Sunrise Public School, the relief school that facilitates the education of child survivors and orphans of Delhi riots 2020, communal violence, targeted demolitions, mob lynching, and other hate crimes. Additionally, it helped in educating the refugees, marginalized children, natural disaster-ridden survivors, and others who were ripped off from their education due to life's challenges.

These children are enrolled across our 13 learning centers, namely Fatima Al-Fihri, Fatima Sheikh, Kulsum Sayani, Sayyidah Nafisa, Begum Sultana Jahan, Taleem ul Quran, Miftahul Quran, Gerda Philipsborn, Bi Amma, Savitri Bai Phule, Wahid Ali Memorial, Habba Khatoon, and Jana Begum.

The Zakaat was also utilized towards empowerment and skill development through our centers, Sabaat and Hunar.
